JHPS MAKES A NICHE IN EDUCATION RANKING

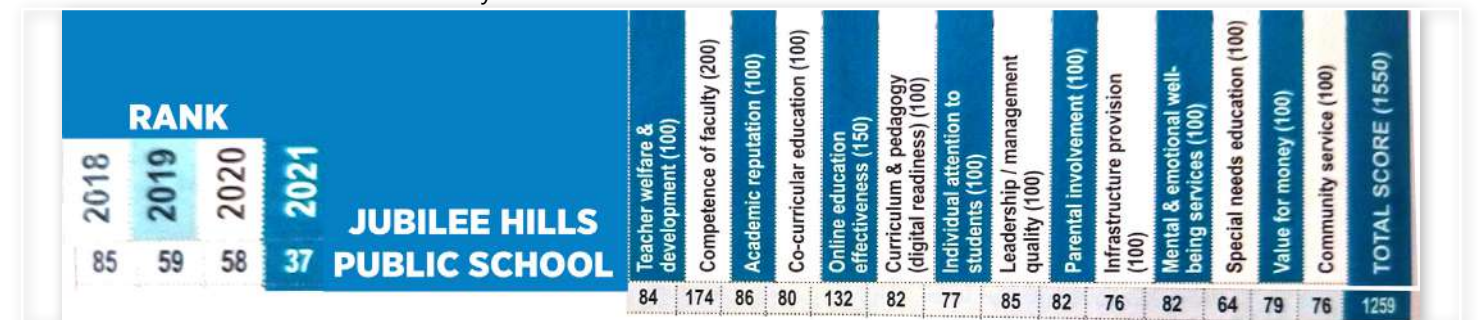

JHPS FITS FOR FIT India Quiz

FIT INDIA Movement was launched on 29th August, 2019 by the Honourable Prime Minister with a view to make fitness an integral part of our daily lives. Fitness and Good Health go hand in hand for a healthy and happy life, following the thumb rule 'Start them Young'. So began The 'Fit India Quiz' at a nation-wide level on fitness and sports for school children. Thus a national platform for students was created to provide them a forum to showcase their knowledge about fitness and sports. And also create awareness among students about India's rich sporting past. This included centuries-old indigenous sports, the sporting heroes of the past and how traditional Indian lifestyle activities held the key to a Fit Life for all ages.

In September 2021 the Preliminary Round of the Fit India Quiz, organised by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports listed participants from 13,502 schools across the country, out of these students from 360 schools across 36 States and Union Territories were short listed for the State Rounds to compete for the Final round for their respective State Championship. The Preliminary Round was a win for the JHPians causing jubilation at Jubilee Hills Public School. SO WHAT EXACTLY IS GRIT?

Grit: The Power of Passion to achieve and Perseverance, Grit

is a character trait that we want to cultivate in our students and ourselves.

The world is changing rapidly. Technologies, tools, and tactics that worked 5 years ago no longer work. What works today, will need to be replaced and reinvented in coming years.

The term Grit is the key to parenting, education and business circles, and for good reason: it is a hallmark of success. People with

Grit combine a strong motivation to achieve long-term goals with the resilience and perseverance to see a goal through to achievement.

Regardless of age, years of experience or any other measure, you need Grit to navigate the old for new changes and adjustments. People who do not give up when facing new challenges, and squarely face the hard work of change come out - 'Winners'. What is this 'Grit' it is not merely a word



of four letters but a word heavily loaded with the master key to survival, resistance, perseverance, resilience, courage, strength of character, strength of will, moral fibre, resolve, determination, stamina, doggedness, tenacity and endurance.

So many powerful facets to Grit can be held together by a single person but how does one know that one has it in their inherent traits and to what quantum? Let us look at a simple measure to gauge one's inner level of 'Grit'. But even before that why should students feel it is important for them and where does it surface as useful?

Student's value Grit because it is the ability to treat your goals like "a Marathon, not a Sprint." A student with Grit is less likely to feel discouraged when performance is poor on a test, or when faced with a difficult question. These students understand that challenges are a part of the journey towards success. The most significant aspect of student's education to put it simply is 'Grit' which



is a combination of a passion for learning, perseverance at a task and activities with a specific purpose or goal to achieve.

Grit is best expressed through actions for your actions speak louder than words. You act upon something, you move forward to achieve your desired goal.

Essentially, it is one's ability to endure and persist over time on a journey towards accomplishing something big. Grit is a combination of desire and fortitude, in which an

individual is willing to do the many small, mundane tasks to realize the dream. Grit is one's ability to overcome adversity, to bounce back from defeat, to learn from failure, and to "keep on keeping on." It is falling down nine times and getting up ten; it is when the going gets tough, the tough get going.

GRIT AND ITS IMPORTANCE

Grit is what turns talent into skill, and turns potential into reality. We all know somebody who was extremely smart, or had great athletic ability, but for whatever reason did very little with either. We also know that the person who surprised us all; nothing apparently out of the ordinary about them, but their hard work and persistence over time focused towards their goals produced incredible results. When talent meets Grit, the potential realized can be enormous. So if you, as a parent or educator, or a child or student want to realize your potential and achieve your most meaningful goals, then the need is to understand what is Grit and how to cultivate it.



SO HOW DO WE DEVELOP GRIT

Here are a few ideas, concepts, strategies that fit one and all to support the development of Grit in oneself.

1. Find A Passion. Kids, especially do not need to know what they will do for the rest of their life, but they do need to identify and pursue passions. In the process of pursuing their passions, which will most likely change over time, they develop grit. Those painstaking classes, guitar lessons, or basketball practices create environments in which kids while pursuing their passions, learn how to overcome challenges and persist. And if by any chance they have a coach urging them on, challenging them, and holding them accountable, even better will be the outcome of the attempt made by the child.

2. Make a practise to say: I Can Do Hard Things. It's the ultimate chicken and the egg: does success breed confidence, or does confidence breed success? The short answer is both. Kids need to counter hard tasks to learn that they can handle hard tasks. The harder the work, the more they know and believe in their potential. So learn to get out of the comfort zones and tackle or take appropriate risks.

3. Learning Not to Quit, When to Quit, and How to Quit. There is a saying that 'Quitting makes a Quitter'. There is some truth that one is quick to quit on things when things get tough and success does not seem close, or when we don't get what we want; this can become a repeating pattern in our lives and rob us of success. Thus Grit encompassing persistence and resilience become essential to achieving long-term, meaningful goals.



4. Own the Struggles and Deal with Frustration. It is definitely difficult to go through a struggle, yet essential to develop through a struggle. So taking risks and struggling is an important way to learn. So when you deal with a skill, activity, or sport that is difficult to master, resist the urge to shout for 'Help' at the same time do not quit at the first sign of discomfort. If you experience feelings of sadness or frustration; bear in mind resilience and perseverance are in the developing process. Remember

'Impossible' is 'I m possible' so struggle is essential to grow and develop your intellectual or muscle power into endurance, tenacity and skills required to face life's challenges.

5. Celebrate Failure, Celebrate Mistakes. Fear of failure and fear of making mistakes are obstacles and can keep one from trying. If no attempt is made, failure is evident. So realise failure and mistakes are a natural by-product of stepping out of the comfort zone and a vital part of the learning process, to become valuable opportunities for learning and growth. So for practise take a step back and closely look at what happened. What tactics, kinds of attitudes, efforts and expectations to best use to suit the goal? No blame game, it becomes counterproductive. Look at control through effort, preparation, perseverance, and attitude.

6. Be positive throughout the Process, so it isn't a matter of 'If', it becomes a matter of 'When? TO "Yes' I will succeed!!

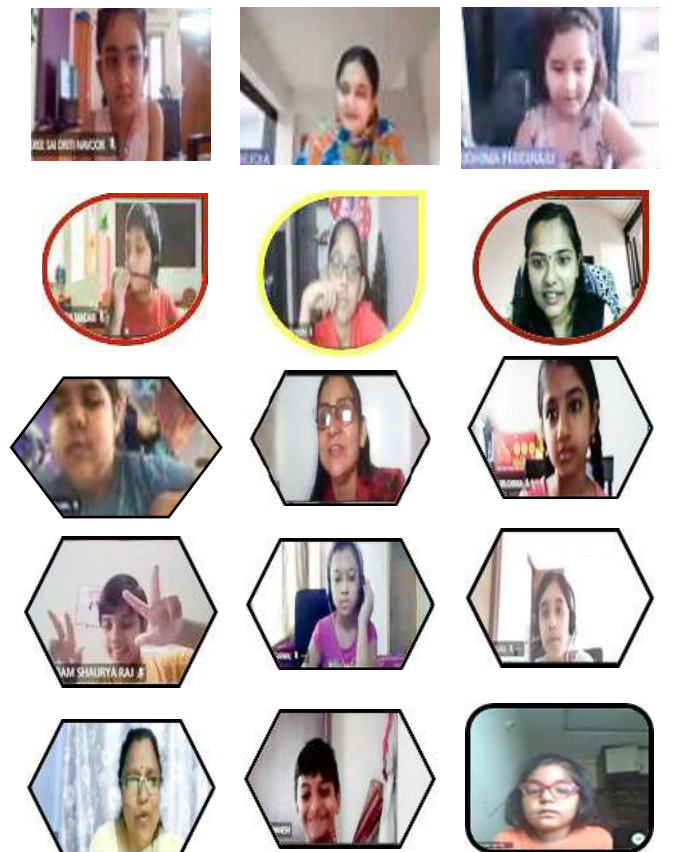
KNOW YOUR CLASSMATES

Q Who/What is the main inspiration for your book?

As a kid I used to read a lot of literature and comic books. My fascination with magic was one of the first things that got me inspired into writing a book. I also wanted to convey a few things like the whole is greater than its parts. The elementals were the embodiments of fire, air, water and Earth respectively; alone they were formidable but when they fought together they were unbeatable. I also wish to convey that people in power such as those who control the elements of nature must be accountable for their actions. They must have something at stake for what they do. Q How do you feel reading the book now?

Q Who is your favourite author?

Rick Riordan is my favourite author. I used to read his books even before I wrote this book and even after I have written one he remains my favourite author to this day.

Q That's wonderful!! Which book or written piece do you go back to reading again and again?

I would say adventures of Tintin written by Herge. Though written 40-50 years ago they are full of humour and are some of the best books I have read. Others include classics like Harry Potter, Sherlock Holmes, and Percy Jackson.

Q Can we expect another book from you as a sequel to 'The Crown of Doom' especially since it ended in a cliff hanger?

Well, a lot of ideas have come to my mind since having written this book. If I were to write a book after this, rather than the continuing this maybe I would have the same theme and characters which would play forward from a different setting or maybe a different time period, something new and creative.

Q Are you currently writing anything?

Currently, I am working on some idea regarding the elementals it has the same characters and theme but the setting is entirely different.

Q What message would you like to give budding writers at JHPS?

I would say they must read as much as possible and explore different genres like fiction, fantasy, etc. and they should try to write as much as possible to express their ideas and make themselves heard. They truly should experience the joy of writing.

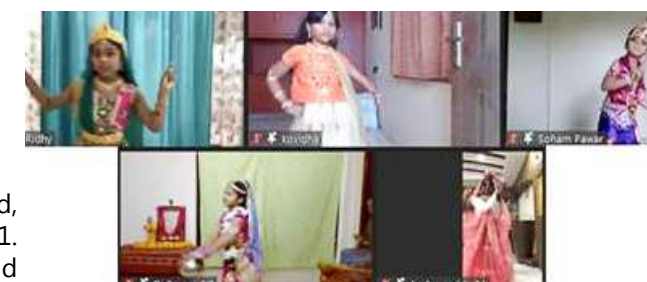

Parents thanked the management for the informative orientation in all the aspects linked to education and development of their ward.

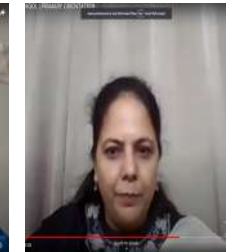

VIEWING NEW AVENUES FAIR AND WORKSHOP

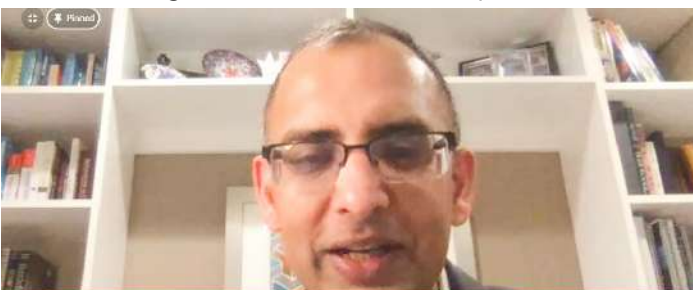
UNSTOPPABLE COMBINATION AT JHPS

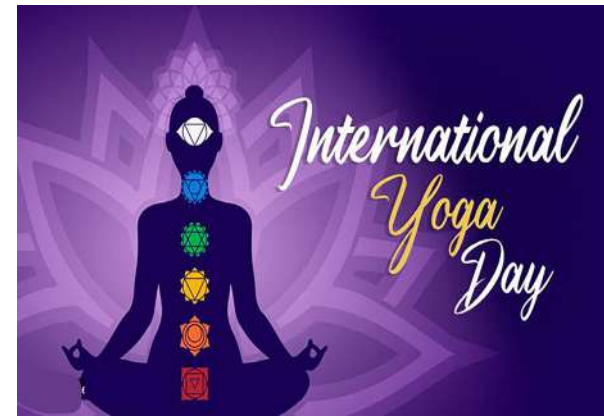

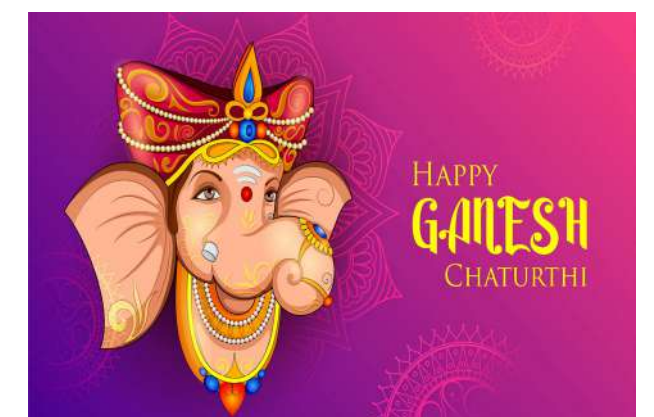

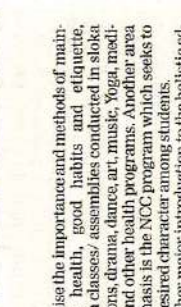

Schools do not want bars, pubs near premises

Hyderabad: Schools in and around Jubilee Hills say that commercial establishments like bars, pubs or even tea shops and small eateries should not be allowed to run business near educational institutes.

Principals and teachers opine that commercial establishments, including tea shops or small eateries, should not be allowed near the school premises as there is a chance that children can consume unhygienic food and these places can become an 'odds' (a hangout place).

"A few days ago, a tea shop was opened near the school. We got it closed with the help of officials keeping student's health in mind," said Varalakshmi M, principal, Jubilee Hills Public School adding that if such establishments come up near the premises, they make it a point to get them removed legally.

In Jubilee Hills, there are over 15 pubs constantly buzzing with activity on Road numbers 36, 45, and 10. Apart from blocking the road traffic, noise pollution is the biggest issue when such establishments are located in residential areas. Most vehicles are parked on road in front of these establishments as they don't have parking, residents complain.

"In a 2 km radius from our school, there are at least five to six pubs," said R Praveen Rao, a Telugu teacher at a school in Jubilee Hills. "Many students pass these pubs to reach school and back home. It is common for them to see someone sleeping out on the roadside, sleeping in the car, empty or broken liquor bottles on roads, or witnessing rash driving. It is wrong to have such establishments near schools."

School staff also point out that there are many bars and pubs in Jubilee Hills.

"We stay right in the heart of residential area and I feel bars, pubs, or other commercial establishments should not be allowed in the area," said a principal of another school in Jubilee Hills.

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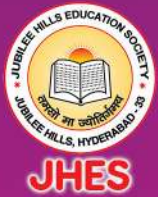
